


Which PPRSSA activities did you participate in? (check all that apply)

How do you get updates about our league and your team? (check all that apply) 112 responses







- No, If a 40+ league got off the ground, Yes.

- Maybe, Having shoulder surgery in January






- I wasn't aware the league gave out rewards.

- Yes, Shirts are nice. Hats looked nice, but materials were scratchy & uncomfortable






- Yes, For the most part but there were a couple of misses where maybe some managers did not know the players very well.

- Maybe at times yes while others, No.




- Yes, The cheapest game around

- Yes, Dave Highland was Excellent






- No. Not at all. If it ain't broke no need to fix it.

- No, There needs to be more than the Catcher responsible for determining if pitch is >12feet.
- No, I think it's tough for the inexperience catchers to call illegal pitches. Not sure what a good fix is though.
- Yes, High/flat pitches are almost never called.
- Yes, It took me a little to get used to the pitches as the ones that hit the very front of the plate are balls in the other league I play in. I would recommend the board be shortened by about 4 inches and the front part of the plate be a ball.
- Yes, Maybe better guidelines for what constitutes an illegal high pitch.
- Yes, low fast pitch should be eliminated
- Yes, Relax pitch height regulations, most people don't know what a high pitch is, and either call it high when it isn't or don't call it high when it is, and it becomes just another source for arguing. Let some of the borderline high pitches go.
- Yes, I think the net should be moved closer to the pitcher to eliminate fast pitches
- Yes, I dislike it when a pitcher avoids a good batter by not trying to give the batter anything decent to hit or intentionally walks the the good batter
- Yes, I would endorse rules that reduce walks. Maybe 4 balls and 2 strikes?
- Yes, More focus on illegal pitches
- Yes, unless we make the screen 7 ft which would cut down on the fast low pitch.
- Yes, Great question. Some people were saying pitching was too high or going around the screen was an issue. Wish every team had at least 2 pitchers per team
- Yes, The pitching screen should be moved 15 feet in front of the pitching rubber.
- Yes, ball hits the ground before it hits the board should not be a strike!!
- Yes, The rules for calling a high pitch need to be discussed and who makes the call for a high pitch.
- Yes, It seems wrong that a strike can be called for a ball that doesn't actually enter the strike zone or doesn't even go past the batter.
- Yes, I think there needs to be some clarification on what constitutes an illegal (high) pitch and who can call a pitch as illegal. Also, I think we should ban
 intentional walks during open innings.
- Yes, A way to better regulate illegal fast or extremely high pitches
- All mats need to be wood so outfielders can hear the audible sound

- Having everyone play at the same time creates two significant issues. There is nobody available to ump the games. I saw a lot of missed calls which mostly favored the team that was up to bat. I almost never saw anyone call pitches that were too high/flat. The other issue is that you don't have enough people to be subs when other teams are short. When a player is loaned out to the other team, it's almost always the worst person on the team which doesn't really send a good message to that person. if you could stagger the start times, that would solve both issues. - That when a batted ball is returned to the infield and in the
 possession of any infielder and said infielder is on the infield
 surface then no base runners shall advance. If base runners are
 between bases then ball is still live and runners can be put out,
 whether advancing or retreating to a base. 50F, 60S, 60F, 70S
- Change the "walk" rule for homeruns over the limit to a "single" that would allow base runners to advance. All outfield players must be behind the outfield line, including rovers when women are at bat. - 50S

- Cut back to one game a day Anonymous 60F
- A practice on weekends if possible. Wednesday midday can be challenging for people who work. Have captains share experience with the games they play and see what can be tweaked mid season when it comes up. - 50S
